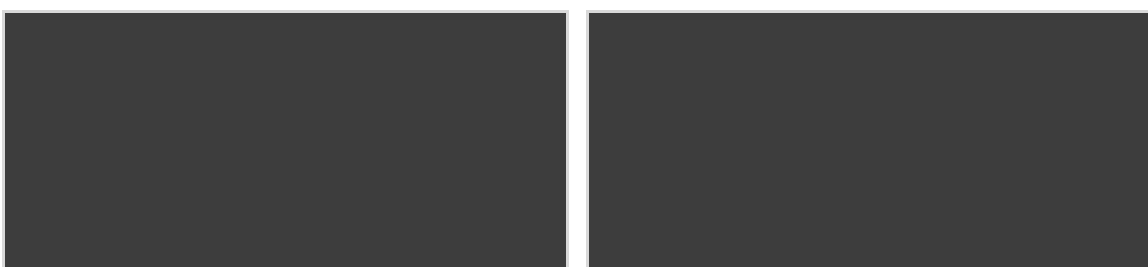

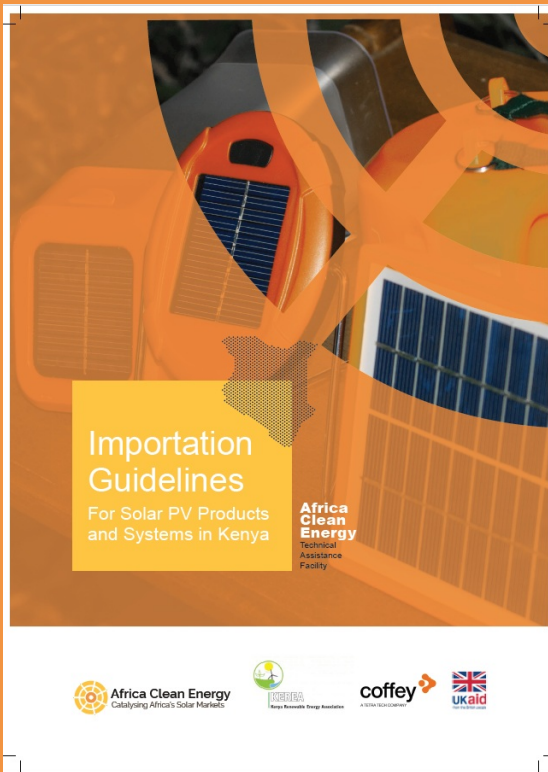

### Enhancing the stand-alone solar market in Africa

In the inception period (December 2018 - May 2019), ACE TAF carried out a series of activities. These activities were developed after consultations with a range of SAS sector experts to identify gaps that could be quickly addressed.

To address the gaps, six information products were developed. These were; an E-Waste Policy Handbook, Sierra Leone's Compact Refresh, Nigeria Importation Handbook, Importation Guidelines for Solar PV Products and systems in Kenya, Kenya Standards Action Plan and the Uganda Solar Water Pumping Report. All the resources will be used during the implementation period of the programme. They will contribute to improved access to reliable energy for poor and vulnerable people in Africa.
